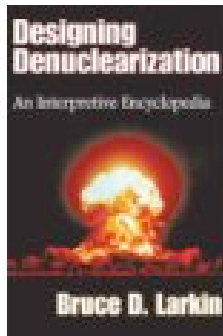


Designing Denuclearization: An Interpretive Encyclopedia
